

June 13 - 1940

A special meeting of the Franklin County Bar Association was held June 13, at 9:30 A.M. in the Court Room.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Edmund C. Wingerd, who stated that the purpose of the meeting was to pay respect to the memory of Isaac J. Wingerd, deceased, and to receive the report of the Committee appointed to prepare appropriate resolutions on the death of Mr. Wingerd.

Question was called for and the motion was unanimously adapted.

The resolution is as follows: -
"The Franklin County Bar Association records with regret the death of Isaac Q. Wingert, for forty-three years a member of the Franklin County Bar, and expresses by its action its esteem for his character and integrity.

Isaac Q. Wingert was born in Guilford Township, Franklin County, Pennsylvania, April 17, 1874, the descendant of a family which had resided in Franklin County since the early half of the Eighteenth Century.

He was educated at the Central State Normal School at Lock Haven, Penna., and the Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle, Penna., from which he graduated with the degree of Bachelor of Laws in June, 1897. He further received his law training in the office of Silas Stuart of Carlisle.

He was admitted to the Bar of Franklin County in December, 1897, and practiced continuously from that time, ^{County} almost the very day of his death, June 10, 1940. He served as Borough Solicitor of the Borough of Chambersburg and later as County Solicitor of Franklin County. During his professional career he served a large clientele with faithfulness, industry and integrity, which were never questioned.

He was active as a member of the First Lutheran Church, Chambersburg.

and also of fraternal organizations including Kearney Lodge No. 159 Knights of Pythias and Columbus Lodge I.O.O.F.

Be it resolved that this association records its regret because of the passing of our fellow member and extended its sympathy to his widow and other members of his family.

And be it further resolved that this resolution be recorded upon the minutes of the Association and that the Secretary of the Association be instructed to send a copy thereof to the members of the family.
